

NAAL AND THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS

The Netherlands Alumni Association of Lanka (NAAL) was formed by twentyfive Founder Members in 1971 and active right throughout up to now. Its Membership is open to all personnel who have undergone a Program of Studies in the Netherlands and today the Enrolment Number has passed 600. It is registered with the Registrar of Companies under the Companies Act of Sri Lanka.

The Executive Committee is annually elected from the General Membership at the Annual General Meeting. All Ex-Co Members do an Honorary service. Meetings of the Ex-Co are generally held monthly. Apart from the gettogethers at the AGM, Committee arranges for the Spouse and the Children of Members to enjoy with the families of the other Members at social gatherings.

This year is extremely important for NAAL as it will be celebrating the Golden Jubilee. To celebrate the "Golden Jubilee" NAAL had organized several activities (a) e-conference (b) supplement on the Netherlands King's birthday (c) Printing a Souvenir to mark the occasion, (d) to have a Symposium and (e) Supplement on the 50th Anniversary on daily papers. We were also planning to hold the Annual General Meeting along with these events.

- To encourage other Holland Alumni Associations and potential members to join in enhancing the relationship with the Netherlands
- To motivate the new generation to take the association forward to a continuous improvement journey.

Evert Jongens a former director of NUFFIC, his contribution to NAAL is mentioned under the Heading of Founders of NAAL in this souvenir.
